By subscription of \$150 each which should accompany the nomination. \$750 to pass the entry box and an additional \$750 to start. For horses not originally nominated, a supplemental payment of \$2,250 along with the entry and starting fees may be made at any time prior to the closing of entries. The Purse to be divided as follows, \$87,000 to the owner of the winner, \$30,000 to second, \$15,000 to third, \$7,500 to fourth, \$4,500 to fifth, \$3,000 to sixth with the remaining \$3,000 to be divided equally amongst the remaining finishers. JAPAN made light contact with the runner up at the start, raced from off the inside throughout, settled into the two path for the start of the run around the bend, loosely drafted behind the leader, got called upon spinning into the stretch, altered course to be outside the front runners at the three-sixteenths pole, closed in on the embattled pair, began to drift out with a sixteenth remaining, went by and edged away. STANFORD stumbled coming out of the gate, brushing with the winner, angled off the inside midway down the backstretch, stalked NONNA'S BOY from the three path on the turn, was switched over to brisk hand encouragement nearing the five-sixteenths marker, spun into the stretch, battled hard for command, bumped lightly with the nemesis while getting carried out a few paths in the final stages, got up for the place. NONNA'S BOY stumbled as the field was being released from the starting gate, but nevertheless onto the lead, showed the way from well off the rail down the backstretch, was guided into the two path at the half mile pole, felt an increase in pressure after completing three-quarters, waited until upper stretch before getting put to a drive, got hooked up a duel with second place finisher, brushed with that foe after drifting out a bit in the last strides, got caught.
