LIATRIS broke outward and brushed with HANDSOME SENOR, quickly straightened and rated kindly while saving ground, responded when nudged on mid turn, angled off the inside gathering momentum in upper stretch, closed nicely under repeated right handed rousing, reeled in the leader approaching the sixteenth pole, eagerly pulled away on her left lead and was only under mild coaxing the final seventy yards. GUDERIAN was hustled clear early and dropped over to secure the inside, widened under rating mid turn, came under pressure in upper stretch, could not withstand the winner nearing the sixteenth marker but kept on willingly to be well clear of the rest. I SAY I WILL, between runners leaving the far turn, shifted in towards the rail through the drive and went evenly late. WOLFTRAP dropped well off the early pace, was under urging cutting the corner into the lane, slipped through inside of a rival near mid stretch, eased out late and kept on with interest. STORMING SIXTY ducked out at the break and was away last, edged up four wide under strong encouragement mid turn, drifted in near the three sixteenths pole and faded. HANDSOME SENOR hopped then was brushed at the break, quickly reached contention, chased three wide into the lane then tired.
